Encourages **curiosity and critical thinking** through student centered learning, allowing students to discover new ideas and concepts.



Finnway's Learner Profiles and Attitudes

At Finnway, we place a strong emphasis on developing key Learner Profiles that help guide students in becoming well-rounded individuals. Each month, we highlight one profile across the school, allowing students to explore what it looks like in action through classroom activities and daily interactions.

At the end of the month, teachers select students who have demonstrated the featured profile, and these students are recognised during our school assembly with a Learner Profile Award. This ongoing focus not only encourages students to reflect on their behaviour and choices but also promotes a positive school culture and supports their personal growth in meaningful ways.



Lunch Time Clubs

At Finnway, students in Primary (starting from Grade 1) have the opportunity to participate in a variety of lunchtime clubs, which are not offered in Kindergarten. These clubs take place during lunch breaks and are led by teachers who are passionate about the activities they run.

From Football, Computers, and Board Games to Dance and Drama, and Kitchen Gardening, students can explore new interests, build important skills like creativity, collaboration, and responsibility, and enjoy learning beyond the classroom. These clubs also help strengthen friendships and contribute to a positive school community.



Football

As part of our after-school offerings in Grade 1, we provide a football training program led by Coach Thae. Any Grade 1 students interested in developing their football skills are welcome to join.

Training takes place every Wednesday and Friday after school at the main campus, offering a fun and active way for students to build teamwork, coordination, and confidence.

Grade 1A/1B students work together through a variety of engaging activities, including:



SUPPORTING YOUR CHILD'S TRANSITION TO GRADE I



TIPS FOR PARENTS

· Talk About School Daily

Encourage your child to share what they did and learned each day. This helps build reflection skills and shows that their learning is valued at home.

Support Regular Reading Habits

Read with your child daily and encourage independent reading at their level. This supports their Reading Diploma goals and helps develop fluency and comprehension.

Encourage Independence

Allow your child to take responsibility for simple tasks such as packing their bag, organising their belongings, and managing their homework.

· Establish a Daily Routine

Consistent sleep, meal, and homework routines help children feel secure and ready to learn.

Celebrate Progress, Not Just Results

Praise effort, resilience, and small achievements. This helps build a growth mindset.

Stay in Communication with Teachers

Use ClassDojo to stay updated on classroom learning and communicate directly with teachers when needed.

Promote Organisational Skills

Help your child learn to manage time, follow a timetable, and check they have everything they need each day.

Talk About Emotions

Help your child recognise and talk about their feelings—starting a new stage can bring excitement and nerves.

Encourage Participation in School Life

Talk about clubs, learner profile awards, and events. These build confidence and a sense of belonging.

• Be Positive and Reassuring

Your attitude helps shape theirs. Show excitement and confidence in their ability to thrive in Grade 1.
